SUSTAINABILITY	<ul> <li>Materials purchased can be used in subsequent years if project is successful.</li> <li>Program can be repeated.</li> </ul>
TIMELINE	<ul> <li>Approximate action plan regarding start/finish/ duration is provided.</li> </ul>
EASE OF EVALUATION OF OUTCOMES & PUBLICITY	<ul> <li>Program evaluation method is clearly described and realistic.</li> <li>Student learning can be showcased in a culminating project or event that can be documented and publicized.</li> </ul>
FIT with the RPEF MISSION	• The project is outside what should be expected from a regular school budget.
INNOVATIVENESS	• The degree to which this is teaching or learning in a new, different, unique, or interdisciplinary way.
